## PASTORAL CARE AND BOARDING COMMUNITY

**Pastoral Care** at Scotch College is tailored and responsive to the needs of individual students.

Your son's emotional well-being is paramount at Scotch. Every boy is regarded as an individual and we take pride in the ability of our staff to understand and address the needs and progress of every student.

*The School Support Team consists of a School Psychologist, Chaplain, House Heads and Teachers. The School Support Team work in consultation with the Headmaster, Deputy Headmaster and the Director of Teaching and Learning, and provide guidance on a boy's choice of subjects, activities and participation in other co-curricular spheres.*

**Boarding** offers a home to students from Year 7 to 12 in three separate horizontal houses.

We offer academic and pastoral support to all our boys in a caring and safe community. We pride ourselves on "Knowing the Boy". We have worked hard to provide strong lines of communication between staff, students and parents and these are very important to us.

**All Year 7 and 8 boarders** are housed in one separate house, reflecting our commitment to growth and development of young adolescent boys. The Year 7/8 Wing is staffed by a Head of Year, Housemother and academic and residential staff, all of whom live either in-house or on campus. In addition, there are four Year 11 "mentors" who live in the house on a rotation. These boys assist with homework and the general well-being of their younger peers. **All Year 9 boarders** are housed in a separate house. The Year 9 is staffed by a Head of Year, Housemother and academic and residential staff, all of whom live either in-house or on campus. In addition, there are four Year 11 "mentors" who live in the house on a rotation. These boys assist with homework and the general well-being of their younger peers. **Seniors boys** are in *Keys House* - known as "The Big House". **Years 10 to 12 boys** are housed in one complex overlooking the Scotch playing fields. This facility was opened in 2003 and houses 105 boys in either single or double accommodation. Year 12 students have their own rooms on a rotation throughout their final year (wherever possible), while students in Years 10 and 11 share double rooms. The Head of Boarding, Assistant Head of Boarding and their families live within the complex, as do six resident masters. A Housemother and two academic staff members are also on staff. Many activities are offered appropriate for each year level.
